**Chad Erickson Aviation
Scholarship Established**

\$5,500 from twenty-one memorial gifts and pledges has been contributed thus far to establish the Chad Erickson Aviation Scholarship Fund, in memory and honor of Chad Erickson '90 who died December 1, 1993 in a tragic Northwest Airlink Flight airplane crash. Chad was the first officer on Northwest Airlink Flight 5719 that crashed near the Hibbing, Minnesota airport.

The named scholarship endowment was established by brothers, family and friends to pay tribute to Chad's life, friendship, and his love and dedication to aviation. The scholarship will go to Delts majoring in aviation, who are enrolled in flight training, and who need financial assistance to continue their flying. Preference will be given to Delts who are holding at least one job during the school term to pay for flying costs. To be eligible, the member must have a cumulative GPA over 2.50 and be a member in good standing with the Chapter. A committee of three aviation alumni will make the selection each year.

An alumni committee is raising the funds for endowment. Serving on the Erickson Memorial Fund Committee are Robert Williams '91, Robb Ramsay '90, J. J. Wolf '90, Fred Sontag '92 and Bob Lieser '82. To date \$4,000 in cash gifts and \$1500 in pledges have been received from 21 contributors. (See **Avition Endowment**)

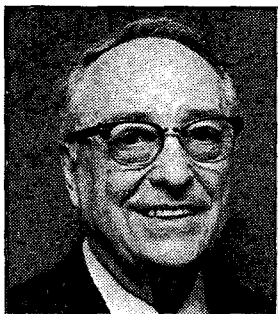
**DELTA XI IS NAMED
DELT 2000 CHAPTER**

Delta Xi Chapter was named a DELT 2000 chapter being one of the initial twenty-five chapters of 130 nationwide to meet the minimum criteria of alumni involvement. This new initiative of the International Fraternity aims to double the number of alumni involved in the development of undergraduate members and their chapters to strengthen the Fraternity. Strong chapters have strong alumni involvement.

John Olin, Ph.D. '61, an entrepreneur manufacturer of high tech instruments from Monterey, CA serves as chair of this initiative. He states, "College students today have experienced more instability in their lifetime than almost any other generation. They often come from fractured families and lack the influence of positive male role models in their lives. Many don't know how to communicate with adult males, but sorely want to. To assuage the pain...some students "medicate" their pain with obsessive behavior related to drugs, alcohol, women and having fun."

Olin continues, "Strong alumni involvement in every one of our chapters provides the grass roots stability and guidance for our undergraduates that will insure our Fraternity's continued success into the next century." Involvement may be as a chapter mentor, house corporation officer, or as a chapter or academic advisor. (See **DELT 2000**)

George Allen Memorials Given to Ed. Foundation



Sixty-four friends, brothers and family members contributed \$5,600 to the ΔΤΔ Ed. Foundation in memory and honor of George Allen '36. This is a fine tribute to a Delt who touched so many lives over six decades. Several Delts wrote notes indicating the high regard in which George was held, noting that many kind words and deeds that Brother Allen extended to them and others. The family requested that memorials be sent to the Delta Tau Delta Educational Foundation, 2501 26th Avenue S., #31, Grand Forks, ND 58201.

The contributions become part of the endowment fund to support the George Allen Improvement Scholarships given each semester to members who receive a semester GPA higher than their cumulative GPA. \$2 is awarded for each one-hundredth improvement. For example, if a student receives a 3.50 semester GPA when his overall GPA is 3.00, he would receive a \$100 George Allen Improvement Scholarship. He established the scholarship in 1972. Dozens of Delts have received the award over the past 22 years, and with the endowment, those scholarships continue for future Delts.

George also provided for the establishment of an endowment fund through the UND Foundation to support the Greek System at UND. Annual income will provide assistance to the Greek System at UND to help it become stronger, and to encourage more alumni involvement and leadership. George served as President of the Interfraternity Council during his college years, and started the IFC sing on the banks of the English Coulee.

The Winter 1994 *Rainbow* carried a condensed version of George Allen's eulogy (Page 51, Chapter Eternal) which is highly unusual. Few obituaries or eulogies have been printed over the years, speaking to the importance of George's death, marking an era has passed. George died

September 23, 1993. He is survived by his wife, Almira (Summers) Maynes, a son Robert Allen '62 (Gamma Tau, University of Kansas) of Bloomington, IL, daughter Judy Smedly of Bakersfield, CA and three stepchildren.

John Artz '66

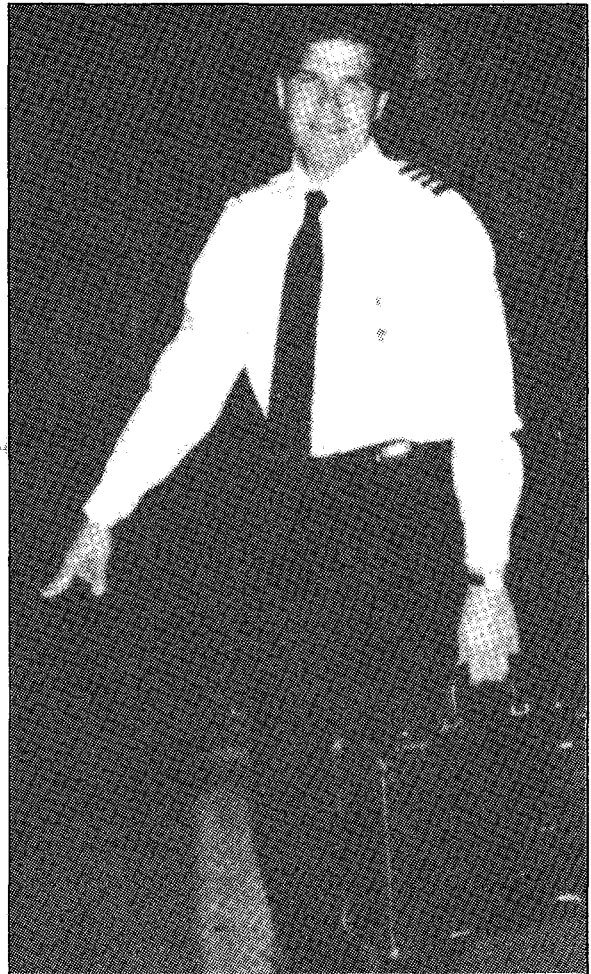

After graduation, he continued with UND as a flight



instructor and Phase check pilot for two years, when he joined Thunderbird Aviation in Eden Prairie, Minnesota. He joined Express Air as a first officer in August 1993. A student pilot called Chad, "a walking encyclopedia of aviation knowledge" and CAS Dean John Odegard said, "he was one of those all-American kids that any father would like to have as a son." about fifty Deltas attended Chad's funeral at Dassell, Minnesota.

TARGET OF \$75,000 TO BE RAISED IN 1994

Our fraternity is celebrating our 75th year on the University of North Dakota campus. Our chapter enjoys a record of true accomplishment as well as individual and group success. Who would believe that a student-run organization would survive that long? The fraternity experience stands the test of time, and continues as a positive influence on college students getting ready for their future careers and families.

Delta Tau Delta at UND has reached a milestone. To prepare for the future, the board of directors of the Educational Foundation set a target of \$75,000 to be raised in 1994 to mark our 75th year, and to move us along towards the \$1 million endowment goal. New funds will increase the endowment to help underwrite scholarships, awards, the leadership academy, and educational programs.

Academy is partially funded by Stanley Moe '32, and to do the programs right, more endowment funds are needed. New library chairs are needed after 15 years of constant use (really, these kids do study and have meetings!). There is much good we can do with a little help from our alumni, friends and parents.

Our Educational Foundation is well-known in the Fraternity world, not only in Delt but among the 65 national fraternities and 35 sororities. It is known for the fund raising success, the program accomplishments, and for the tremendous loyalty of our alumni. It is not only the contribution of money by alumni, but also the gifts of time and expertise. Each year, scores of alumni return to Delta Xi to share of their life experiences, offering a helping hand to our members. What a fine way to help others lift their heads above the crowd.

Tuition has doubled in the last ten years, but financial aid and wage rates have not kept up.

Funds are needed for membership education like career Mentoring, national speakers and conferences, The Leadership

North Dakota Deltas were recently named a "top ten" chapter in the nation by receiving the prestigious Hugh Shields Award. Last year Delt was named the top fraternity on the UND campus. Four times since 1985 our chapter has been named to the Court of Honor -- a top twenty chapter. This Delt success story resulted from a partnership of undergraduate effort and alumni investment. Most of us started our lives on the foundations created by others. Let us build a stronger foundation for our future Deltas.

DELTS GIVE TO UND FOUNDATION

For ten years, the UND Foundation has allowed, even encouraged, Delts to make gifts to the UND Foundation earmarked for the Delta Tau Delta Educational Foundation. Since 1983, more than \$170,000 has been donated to the UND Foundation for Delt, approximately one-fourth of the total cash gifts to the Delt Foundation.

There are several reasons why Delt alumni have utilized the UND Foundation for gifts. Mostly, it has allowed Delts who work for companies which provide matching gifts to double or triple their gifts to the Fraternity. Most matching gift companies allow the donor to earmark their gifts on campus, as long as they are made through the University Foundation office. Secondly, the gifts to the Fraternity are recognized by membership in the UND Foundation giving clubs. Also Delts who give to several groups on campus can "package" their gifts, maximizing their giving club level participation. For

example, if \$5,000 goes to Delt, and \$5,000 to their college department, donors become members of the \$10,000 President's Club.

When funds go directly to the UND Foundation, a 10% fund raising charge is made by the UND Foundation. However, if the checks (made out to the UND Foundation) are sent to the Delt Foundation because of our fund raising efforts, no 10% charge is made. To maximize your gift to the Delt Foundation, send it first in the Delt return envelope, and let us walk your gift through. That also maximizes the chances your gift will be properly credited.

Earl Strinden and his staff at the UND Foundation office have been excellent to work with over the past decade, and thus also enjoyed the strong support of Delt for their efforts. When you see Earl, thank him for his support of Delt and the Greek System.

Steve Kramer Establishes Post-Graduate Scholarship

Stephen P. Kramer '68 of Springfield, Oregon has established the Kramer Post-Graduate Scholarship Fund to encourage and assist Deltas to pursue post-graduate education at the University of North Dakota. Each recipient will receive \$1,000 semester scholarship for the term of their graduate studies - two to four years.

Brother Kramer wants to help Deltas attend graduate school who lack the financial resources to do so. Criteria established in the scholarship agreement include financial need, aptitude and attitude for completing an advanced degree, and leadership within the Fraternity. Academic performance may be considered, but not be the primary consideration. Preference will be given to Deltas attending law school, but it is open to all graduate studies.

Selection will be made by application to the scholarship committee of the Delta Tau Delta Educational Foundation. Recipients will be known as Kramer Graduate Fellows. Reports need to be filed after each semester on the academic progress to continue scholarship funding. For law school, recipients would receive \$6,000, and for medical school \$8,000, with continued academic progress.

Steve is a native of Douglas, North Dakota, and served as Treasurer of the Fraternity. His contemporaries considered him one of the finest treasurers in the Chapter, always keeping excellent track of all accounts and bills. He received his Bachelor's degree in 1968, and his Juris Doctorate Degree in 1973. Upon Graduation he served as a trial attorney in Washington, DC. with the Interior Department and later the Labor Department.

In 1982 Kramer was appointed as a Federal Administrative Law Judge with the Social Security Administration, for whom he still works. He has lived in Springfield, Oregon (near Eugene) since 1986, enjoying his home on a trout stream. Steve has been a very successful real estate investor, allowing him to invest in Delt. He started investing in real estate while in Washington, and has continued that investment activity in Oregon.

Steve visited the Chapter during the 75th year celebration, meeting with chapter members and alumni. While establishing the scholarship fund, he stated, "I want to help Deltas attend graduate school, and I want to be sure a graduate education remains available to students who do not have strong financial help from their families. I was able to go through school by working and with loans, but that is really impossible today with the escalating cost of higher education." He added, "This is a good time for me to invest in Delt, and as long as I am doing well, this is a way I can help Deltas who need a little financial assistance." Thanks Steve for helping young Deltas of promise get a rung higher on the ladder to success.

The State Board of Higher education recently approved increased in tuition and fees for the 1994-1995 academic year. Graduate Tuition and fees has increased to \$2,638 for North Dakota students, and \$3,218 for Minnesota students. For Law it is \$3,848 (ND) and \$4,482 (MN), and Medicine is \$8,778 (ND) and \$10,894 (MN). Undergraduate tuition is \$2,428 (ND) and \$2,956 (MN). Room and board was increased to \$2,703 per year.

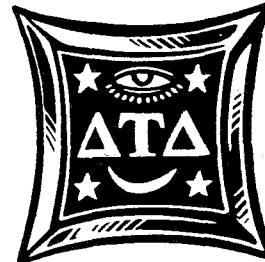
